The strength of any school community is a direct reflection of the commitment of those people willing to go the extra yard to ensure its excellence. Thank you!

#### News from the August 31<sup>st</sup> meeting of the Council of Commissioners

Michael Chechile, the LBPSB's Director General since the retirement of Bob Mills in July, was welcomed to his first Council meeting in his new capacity. A number of **Administrative Appointments** were approved, significant among them the naming of Veronique Marin as the Director of Schools for Region 1, replacing Stephen Colpitts who is now the Interim Director of Human Resources. In addition, Christopher Fuzessy, previously the Assistant Director of Student Services was appointed Interim Director of Schools for Region 2. Finally, as a cost-saving measure, the former post of Director of Continuing Education (V. Marin's previous position) was not filled; instead, the Assistant DG, Steve Balleine, will be directly responsible for the Vocational Training Centres such as the Gordon Robertson Beauty Academy while the Adult Education Centres such as Place Cartier will join Region 1, so continuing to be the responsibility of V. Marin.

#### 2015-2016 Budget

The Council of Commissioners adopted a balanced 2015-2016 school board budget following receipt of the final budget rules from the Ministry of Education, Higher Education and Research (MEESR) in July. The Ministry has cut funding to school boards with the LBPSB seeing a \$3 million reduction in its subsidies including, despite the Minister's public statements to the contrary, grants for students with special needs and for school success. The MEESR authorized the board to negate a \$1,660,873 deficit by using its past accumulated surpluses to balance. As many of you have heard, through savings realized through attrition, a reduction in executive compensation, and other cutbacks, funding became available over the summer to ensure the provision of documentation technology resources for each elementary school library; many of the library technicians laid off in the spring have been rehired on a full or partial basis. Also, the Chair of the LBPSB assured Council that there were no cutbacks in services for special needs students (eg. Integration Aids) contemplated.

## News from the Sept. 28<sup>th</sup> meeting of the Council of Commissioners

The formula for **funding of Governing Boards** in 2015-16 will remain the same as it was in 2014-15.

Council launched the **Enrolment Criteria for 2016-2017** consultation as is required under the Education Act with responses due by November 27th. It should be noted that while no changes are contemplated from 2015-2016, the existing policy does contains the following provision *"Exceptions to the Enrolment Criteria document may be necessary for schools affected by the Board's Major School Change Policy".* 

Two additional **Administrative Appointments** were approved: Marie-Eve Claude, the LBPSB's Coordinator of Student Services, will become the new Assistant Director of Student Services replacing Christopher Fuzessy while France D'Aoust, previously of the Sir Wilfrid Laurier School Board, will become the new Director of Finance.
