Addendum #2

Commissioner's Report – December 2015

Certainly the main business of the Council of Commissioners over the last month has been **Major School Change**. Hearings were held on the evenings of Nov. 17th, 18th and 19th at Verdun Elementary, Westwood Junior High and John Rennie High respectively during which some 25 schools and other interested parties expanded on their briefs and answered questions from commissioners. Currently, the senior administration of the LBPSB is considering all the input received as well as a vast array of demographic data concerning past, present and projected future enrollment in our schools to develop various scenarios for commissioners to consider. Specific proposals are then expected to be debated at the Council of Commissioners meeting on December and be voted upon. Any MSC resolutions adopted will come into effect as of registration for the 2016-2017 school year.

November 30th meeting of the Council of Commissioners

An excellent presentation entitled "**Kids Can Create Change**" was presented by BHS students Isabel and Jane Szollosy focusing on the Sparkes of Hope initiative in the Dominican Republic furthering the education of young Haitian emigrants who otherwise would have no access to formal schooling. The significant contribution of the BHS community and other LBPSB schools in supporting this project was highlighted. The Szollosy sisters received a well-deserved standing ovation from the assembled commissioners following their presentation!

Several **administrative appointments** were approved including that of the current principal of Dorval Elementary, Erik Olsthoorn, as the new Coordinator of Student Services. Replacing him at Dorval Elementary as of Feb. 1st will be Wusua Mitchell – retired administrator Jan Langelier will be there in the meantime. Also, Valeria Forgetta was named Assistant Director of Finance and Martine St. Pierre will become the new Coordinator of Human Resources.

Due to the strike action of November 17th, the current **2015-2016 calendar** was amended such that the board-wide pedagogical day of Friday, May 20th will now be designated a regular school day. The Director General also announced that one or more school-level ped. days will need to be re-designated by each school to maintain the minimum 180 days of instruction required.

Transportation announced a GPS pilot project whereby the location of school buses could be tracked by parents on computers and other smart devices. If successful, this initiative could be introduced on a boardwide basis next year.

A new two-year contract with Guardium Sécurité for the Judicial Records verification (**Background Checking**) of new employees, stagiares and volunteers was approved which should result in significant savings for the board.

The next meeting of the Council of Commissioners is scheduled for Monday, December 14th at 7:30 pm. 14th (at Lindsay Place High School Auditorium). As with all Council meetings, proceedings are webcast live at http://www.lbpsb.qc.ca/eng/home.asp and are also available later in an archived version.

Action Plan for This Year

- A) Lockdowns Per School & Procedures:
- The Lockdown Procedure can be located in each school's Emergency Preparedness Binder; it is a procedure that needs to be reviewed yearly. If changes are proposed to the Emergency Preparedness Policy it must be re-opened by council and follow the process of review
- There is a different Lockdown procedure for Elementary & High School
- Every school has an identified evacuation site which is situated off school property
- It was suggested by F. Clarke & & T. Samolis to compose a letter to request the reopening of the Emergency Preparedness Policy; this suggestion will be brought to the next Elementary & High School Regional Parent meetings
- B) Bullying
- Anti bullying plans should be reviewed/approved every year by all Governing Boards
- The law requires that we tabulate bullying statistics in all LPBSB schools
- Because of the plans & strategies that each school has put into place, we are confident that bullying in our schools is under control
- There is a section in the LBPSB Strategic plan that is specific to bullying
- C) GPS on School Buses
- It was announced at the Transportation Committee that Dorset & Macdonald High School will both be piloting the school bus GPS App
- More information to come on this initiative at the December Regional Parent
- 5) During the December 10th meeting, before the region meeting we saw the movie made at Westwood High School, a LBPSB school.

Silent Majority is a Canadian movie project based on the true story of a ADAM TANGUAY having been bullied in primary, secondary and vocational training. It is the english adaptation of Période Infernale, the french version produced and distributed in Quebec' schools in 2011. The new movie is co-produced by author Adam Tanguay himself and realized by filmmaker DOMINIC BOUFFARD from db promedia inc. In adapting the film in English, the author wants to educate a wider audience by distributing it across Canada and the United States. Silent Majority is expected to be launch in September 2015.

Addendum #4 Daycare Report

Daycare Notes-December 2015

<u>Pancake Breakfast</u>: was held late November! Over 150 students were able to participate. No additional cost was charged to the parents. It is the intention of the daycare to hold another pancake breakfast mid-winter. The children really enjoy spending time with friends sharing a meal.

<u>Christmas Carnival</u>: changing the theme this year we switched from a pizza Christmas Party to a Daycare Christmas Carnival. It was an overwhelming success. Over 165 students participated. Again parents whose children did not attend regularly on the date were invited to participate at no additional charge. The senior daycare group students and the daycare educators produced 14 carnival games with a passport. Prizes were distributed at the end of the day at the daycare door to every participant.

<u>Pizza Mania Ped Day</u>: 100 students participated in this Ped day. All made their own pizza, played pizza games and made a chef hat! Was good to see kids cooking on their own!

<u>Budget Training</u>: I went to a budget workshop in November to help in produce a balanced budget especially given the reductions in government funding.

<u>New Term - Classroom Use</u>: teachers have been more than accommodating as we changed classrooms for the second term. Some even offered their class again for the second term. Thank you to those teachers who are so supportive.

<u>Last day of school</u>: the school is running on Friday, December 18th for a full day. Daycare will be running regular hours from 7am to 6pm. We distributed a form today to help facilitate the dismissal on the last day. As an exception, parents are allowed to make changes to their normal daycare schedule as long as they have completed the forms distributed this week.

<u>Outstanding fees</u>: because of strike days, invoices for December were not produced until after the teachers strike day. Hard copies and electronic invoices have both been distributed to all parents who have an outstanding fee. Electronically, an invoice was sent to all parents so that they can review it, even though they do not have an outstanding fee. Parents were very receptive. There were a few inquiries which were clarified. Very helpful to send invoices periodically to parents so that they are aware of what they are being charged for.

<u>Daycare Rate Increase</u>: effective January 2016 the daily daycare rate will increase to \$8.10/day from \$8.00/day. I will be attending a workshop to implement these changes. The notification for rate increase is currently on the web site and the daycare handbook will be modified in the New Year
