

Chairperson's Message

The 2016-2017 School Year began with a "whoosh" as we returned to school during the completion of our plumbing project which finally saw all our bathrooms upgraded, including auto-flushers which definitely gave some of our younger kids a scare at times ©

Miss Ulla officially became the school's new secretary, taking on this new challenge much to the Principal's relief who feared having to do that job as well ©

As a result of the Major School Change, our numbers were down to 397 students registered in 2016-2017 compared to the 460+ in prior years. However, this did allow us to give Daycare their own room this year which allowed them to participate in Open House with a montage of photos on the smart board as well as other items for parents and students to see.

Other changes to the school included revamping the library, new UDL classrooms, and a new Snoezelen-inspired relaxation room. Parents were able to take all this in during portfolio night.

As always, thanks to our very-engaged Home & School and dedicated staff, there were ample opportunities provided to students for enhancing their curriculum through the arts, music, challenges, projects, and field trips. This year, they definitely made history by raising \$6,000 for our school in one day for the Ford Drive Event!

The 2016-2017 Edgewater theme was "Around The World" which gave each class a chance to explore the world in various learning activities.

And for the first time in recent memory, Edgewater was closed twice this year, the first for a Snow Day and the second due to the flooding in the area where the community at large came together to help those that were impacted by it. Ms. Lamothe's Grade 5 class also won \$1,000 for a charity of their choice from their act of "Paying it Forward" and making muffins for the flood relief volunteers. They chose to donate their \$1,000 to the West Island Palliatives Care Residence.

Actions and Events

Physical Education had a renewed interest this year with Ultimate Frisbee, Grades 4-6 intramural Omnikin tournament, Pilo Polo tournament for cycle 1 students, and Grade 5 and 6 students playing in the March Madness Basketball Intra-mural tournament. Also, thanks to the money that was donated to our school from the Pierre Lavoie Défi challenge last year - Grades 1-3 students got a chance to learn about Curling.

Field Trips included a winter outing to Notre-Dame-de-Fatima, visits to Labonte Farm, Quinn's Farm, the Eco-Museum, the Amerindiens "Droulers", Junior Leadership Day at Westpark Jr., and the Montreal Planetarium. The students were also exposed to a number of plays and events like Annie Jr., the Studio de Danse Montreal for the Digital Citizenship Play "Delete", the Montreal Museum of Fine Arts, Shrek the Musical, and TOPS.

Annual activities included the Terry Fox run, Great Kindness Challenge, and Anti-Bullying Week. This year, our annual Art Vernissage was held over two days in order to ensure everyone a chance to enjoy it. Even Daycare participated by creating an art project of birds around the world.

For the Anti-Bullying event in December, Home & School brought back Dare 2 Care for a series of workshops and lectures which were extremely appreciated. For Anti-Bullying Week, we had our yearly Pink Shirt day anti-bullying awareness assembly, and repeated the LBPSB-approved Anti-Homophobia program.

Edgewater's love of Reading was in full swing this year with various activities including a Grade 4 Read-a-thon for Education Fundraiser and school-wide PJ day, a Book Club trip to Elite Daycare to read to pre-schoolers, Ms. Anto and Home and School's organization of another excellent "Born to Read" event, Concours de Lectures, and the Battle of the Books event. Also, for the first time ever, the Edgewater Book Club participated in the KidsLit Quiz Ottawa Heat as the sole representatives from Quebec!

Finally, Ms. Randle's Grade 6 class won first prize in the CBC Radio Scary Stories contest and received a visit by Kenneth Oppel and a producer from CBC radio to record parts of their discussion with the class, who were all given a copy of his new book "The Nest"!

Although there are a lot of items and events listed in this report, there are still a lot more that have happened and continue to happen every year. Information on all events can be found in the Governing Board minutes although, in my opinion, the best way to stay abreast of everything in the school is to be actively involved in the Governing Board or Home & School.

Sadly, this year we must bid adieu to Liz Rivard who has been guiding our school for the last 5 years. We wish her all the best in her new role. We are certain she will have as positive an impact there at John Rennie as she did with our children here at Edgewater. Since we know assignments change every few years, there is a high probability that some of us will be working with her again in the future! ©

Commissioner's Report- Governing Board – Edgewater Elementary

News from the May 29th Meeting of the Council of Commissioners

New school and centre administrative assignments for the 2017-2018 school year were announced, including a new Principal for Edgewater, **Shirley Kapitsky**, formerly a teacher at St. Anthony School in Pierrefonds. Liz Rivard moves on to become a Vice-Principal at John Rennie High School.

The full complement of school/centre administrative changes has been posted on the LBPSB website at http://www.lbpsb.qc.ca/eng/home.asp

In addition, a number of senior administrative appointments/changes were announced. These included **David Chisholm**, currently the Assistant Director of Human Resources, to the position of **Regional Director**, **Region 1**, replacing **Veronique Marin** who becomes the **Director of International Services**. The current Director of International Services, **Steven Colpitts**, will become the new **Director of Educational Services**, taking over from Tom Rhymes. **Paula Pedroso**, currently Director of the P.A.C.C. Adult Ed. Centre was appointed to the newly-created position of **Director of Continuing Education**. (The vacant position of Assistant Director of Human Resources should be filled at the end of June.)

Following consultation with the Parents' Committee and the Pearson Teachers Union, the Youth Sector School Calendar for the 2018-2019 school year was adopted. It should be posted soon on the board website.

Also following consultation and extensive review, the completely-revised **By-Law 5: Code of Ethics and Professional Conduct Applicable to the Council of Commissioners** was adopted. The modifications incorporated provide for additional transparency, more stringent sanctions and an overall improved process that addresses problems identified with the old version of the By-Law. As is required annually by the Education Act, the LBPSB's **Three-Year Plan of Allocation and Destination of Immovables** was adopted.

Approval has been received from the Ministry of Education for the LBPSB to define **12 election** wards for the next school board elections, currently scheduled for November 2018. This is the same number as in 2014 although several wards will have their boundaries modified.

It was announced that the CS Marguerite-Bourgeoys will take possession of the former **Thorndale** Elementary School building at the end of May and plans to operate an elementary school there next year.

The Parents' Committee brought our attention to the excellent online **free tutoring** services that are made available through Learn Quebec – see http://www.learnquebec.ca/information-about-online-tutoring

The School Tax Management Committee of the Island of Montreal informed Council that **2017-18** school tax rates are being increased marginally from the previous year: \$0.17873 per \$100 of assessed property value for the 2017- 2018 fiscal year, an increase from last year's rate of \$0.17789.

The Pearson Educational Foundation announced that it has created a special fund – the **Rona Cupak Flood Relief Fund** - to direct aid to the families of flood victims attending LBPSB schools.
