Addendum #2 May 1st, 2018 GB Commissioner's Report

Highlights of the April 30th Meeting of the Council of Commissioners

On the recommendation of the Director General, Council undertook a series of school-level **Administrative Appointments** for the 2018-2019 school year. These appointments have now been posted on the school board website.

In addition, a number of Head Office appointments were made which include Kurt Binnie, currently the Director of Information Technology at the University of Toronto, who will be replacing the LBPSB's longtime Director of Information and Technology, François Dupuis, who is retiring in July. Mr. Binnie's new title will be *Director of Innovation and Technology*. Also, Stephanie Stever was appointed as *Coordinator of Student Services* after filling the position on an interim basis for some time.

A number of renovation projects were approved in numerous schools with all work to be undertaken this summer.

As recommended by the Executive Committee, approval was given for the LBPSB to participate in the Comite de gestion de la taxe scolaire de l'ile de Montreal's *Group Purchasing Plan* for 2019-2020 for printer toner, paper, art supplies, robotics, social and educational games, printed envelopes, office supplies, ballasts, fluorescent tubes and incandescent lamps, garbage bags, hand towels and toilet paper, chemical products and cleaning supplies, heating oil.

Council adopted the **2018-2019 Student Transportation Organizational Plan** as recommended by the Transportation Advisory Committee. In addition, TAC reported that full implementation boardwide should commence in the Fall 2018 for the **Bus Planner - Where's My Bus?** application.

Council resolved that the draft *LBPSB Vision and Values Statement* be distributed for *consultation* during the week of April 30, with responses to be returned to the Secretariat no later than June 20 for consideration such that the final version can be adopted at the regular meeting of the Council of Commissioners of June 26.

As recommended by Programs and Services Committee, and following a comprehensive consultation, Council approved the revised *Evaluation of Student Learning Policy* to be effective immediately.

To begin to replace its aging *fleet of trucks*, Council awarded a contract for the purchase of nine (9) new Ford Transit service trucks to the lowest compliant bidder, West Island Ford.

Full minutes of council meetings are eventually posted on the school board website once approved by Council at the subsequent Council meeting.

The next regular meeting of the Council of Commissioners is scheduled for Monday, May 28th at 7:30 pm.

Deep Learning by Thomas Rhymes

□ Deep learning is a new long-term research-based pedagogical framework for LBPSB students.

□ Deep learners develop the 6 C's: Creativity, Communication, Citizenship, Critical Thinking, Character, and Collaboration

□ Focuses on building student engagement throughout their academic life. Engagement is a key part of the LBPSB strategic plan

□ Aims to educate students for the future, not just an exam, while still supporting the QEP

□ It is a slow process and a transformation. In 2017, seven schools had begun piloting this framework. By Spring 2018, all Elementary Schools will embrace this philosophy. By Fall 2018, all Secondary, Adult and Vocational Centers will be using this framework.

This was discussed with Tom Rhymes in person, but the response is not being submitted.

□ Administrative staffing changes were announced and are posted on the front page of the LBPSB website

□ Two new Consultations have been launched – Council and Executive Committee meeting dates for 2018 -2019, and the Vision and Values Policy. Both responses are due by June 20, 2018 and have been posted on Basecamp

□ Council caucus session included a presentation by QESBA President, Jennifer Maccarone, as well as a consultant hired by QESBA to review their mandate; the QESBA Spring Conference will take place in Quebec City from May 24-26, 2018, where a plan will be presented

□ The SNAC AGA will be held on Wednesday, September 26, 2018 at 7:00 PM in main boardroom of the LBPSB

□ SNAC is in the process of redefining the role of the optional IEP Rep on Governing Board and is requesting that the information provided to schools in their AGA kits be modified

Addendum #4 Daycare Report – May 2018

Tax Receipts:

The second issue of tax receipts was issued at the end of April. Other than a few families asking for duplicates it was a very smooth tax season.

Daycare Week:

The week of May 14th is daycare week this year. Each school was asked to create a school flag/banner/coat of arms to decorate the head office board room. The daycare will be holding a few special activities for the students (pancake breakfast, grilled cheese mania, science demonstrations, giant bubble blowing ending with a picnic at Parc Olmpique on the 18th.) We are hosting a Hawaiian luncheon for the daycare and lunch staff plus a few other treats throughout the week.

Brault and Bouthillier: 3 staff did attend a workshop at Brault and Bouthillier. The workshop focuses on new innovative games and creative art projects. The staff also picked up cooperative games and supplies as the company offers a discount to LBPSB daycares on this day.

Registration 2017-18: It's that time of year! Registration forms for the daycare and lunch program were distributed Monday. An ERMS went out to inform parents to check their child's school bags. The daycare has not heard anything yet about any fee increases for the new school year.

Chartwells: As per our request to Chartwells, we participated in a 2 week pilot project to establish if their proposed improvements to delivery and the service will lessen the cost in distribution at EW.

Ped Days 2017-2018: In order to have the opportunity to have a full staff workshop/training, request that Governing Board approve that the daycare closes on a ped day in mid-winter to facilitate the training.

Art Vernissage: For the second time, the daycare participated in the art vernissage. The students created a life size totem pole with each group taking on a different color to carry out the school wide theme this year. It is living in the front foyer currently.

Open House: The daycare will also be participating in the open house this year. Both daycare rooms will have a montage of photos on the smart board as well as other items for parents and students to see, taste-test and play!

Litterless Lunch: In celebration of Earth Day we challenged the whole school to a litterless lunch. With over 400 students participating we ended up with only 1/3 of a garbage bag of garbage and a tub of composting foods. Mr. George did not even have to collect garbage from the classrooms after lunch! A huge success! Ms Lise's Grade 4 and Ms Mona's Grade 3 class were the winners. Both classes received reusable sandwich containers with a small treat inside.

Clubs: With the onset of the good weather we are winding down our lunch clubs. Chess will have one more week. The morning daycare clubs will continue for a few more weeks.

New PM Daycare Procedures: The whole school is being dismissed at 3:20pm. Daycare students meet their daycare educator in their assigned daycare classes. It seems to be working well and we are eliminating one more transition for the students plus it will save a considerable amount of money.

June Invoicing: The board has encouraged us to invoice in May for June daycare and lunch fees. Rather than waiting until June. EW invoicing should be done for June by May 23, 2018.
