# Addendum #2 March 25, 2019 Commissioner's Report

It was announced earlier this month that the LBPSB will be losing two of its senior administrators. Paula Pedroso, the Regional Director responsible for Continuing Education, has been appointed by the Ministry as the Anglophone representative responsible for negotiations of the 2020-2025 teachers' Collective Agreement, effective March 25th. And Chris Fuzessy, the Regional Director for Region 2, has accepted the position of Superintendent for Foothills School Division in High River, Alberta, effective June 10th . Both Paula and Chris will be sorely missed!

The Educational Services Department was authorized to operate a Summer School Program, where the numbers warrant, at John Rennie High School and LaSalle Community Comprehensive High School from July 8, 2019 to August 2, 2019. Where the numbers warrant, transportation (at cost) will be provided to students attending the JRHS site and residing within the LBPSB's territory off the island of Montréal. However, Cycle I Summer School will be offered for the first time using a Virtual Classroom (online) model rather than at either school. As is required annually by section 211 of the Education Act,

Council adopted a resolution authorizing the distribution for consultation of the draft of the proposed Three-Year Plan of Allocation and Destination of Immovables of the LBPSB 2019-2022 be distributed for consultation to our consultative partners of during the week of March 25 with responses to be returned to the Secretariat no later than May 20. The final draft of the Three-Year Plan will be submitted for adoption at the regular May meeting of the Council of Commissioners.

Noel Burke, the Chair of the LBPSB, reported the likelihood that a Major School Change plan will be brought forward before the end of the school year affecting certain high schools for the 2020-2021 school year.

The Central Students Committee felt that field trips are an important asset to their education viewing them as a different way of learning - good for mental health - interaction with peers - teamwork - everyone learns in unique ways – self-knowledge - visual learners can benefit- connects class to real life - most efficient way to learn in depth

• The question regarding whether parents should be asked to contribute resulted in the recommendation that there should be a balance – If mandatory school should pay - If a student cannot afford it, the school should subsidize.

The Human Resources Committee reported that Matthew Wilson, a teacher from Macdonald High School, is the new president of the Pearson Teachers Union (PTU). He replaces Heidi Yetman, who was recently acclaimed as President of the Quebec Provincial Association of Teachers (QPAT). Mr. Wilson was present at the meeting and inquired concerning the board's reaction if/when the bill prohibiting employees working in the public sector in a position of authority from exercising their functions while wearing religious symbols is adopted. The HR Committee also reported that planning for 2019-2020 Administrative staffing is underway with some six Principals / Centre Directors expected to retire at the end of June. Appointments are normally done at the April Council of Commissioners meeting.

Assistant DG Carol Heffernan announced that the LBPSB will shortly be adopting guidelines for management of Extreme Heat conditions in schools and centres. In addition Council resolved to reestablish a Green Committee to make recommendations on increasing environmental awareness, recycling and other environmental initiatives. After a development process of over two years involving all employee groups Council adopted a new Policy on Employee Proficiency Practices Evaluation and Support Program. On a recommendation from the Facilities and Security Committee, Council adopted a resolution increasing the current rate for the rental of facilities by 2% for the 2019-2020 school year.

The Pearson Educational Foundation announced that there still are some tickets available for the Comedy Benefit Show on April 5th at Lakeside Academy in Lachine featuring comedian Mike Paterson. Tickets are \$25 and are limited to those 18+. ## Addendum #3 Parent's Committee Report

#### MEETING SUMMARY REPORT

**ATTENDEES:** Representatives of 26 of 48 member schools as well as SNAC, and Commissioner Representing the Parents' Committee (elected by SNAC), Angela Berryman, were in attendance. Thomas Rhymes, representing the administration, Noel Burke, representing the Council of Commissioners, EPCA President Rhonda Boucher, and a member of the public were also in attendance. Please see attached attendance record for further details.

#### **UPDATES:**

□ School Fees and Field Trips: PC requested a directive from Senior Admin that would clarify this issue for Governing Board members moving forward, as there does not appear to be any consistency between GBs as to what is allowed to be charged to parents and what isn't. T. Rhymes said the direction was intentionally vague because Admin did not want to place restrictions on the governing boards interpretation and plans as it pertained to the proposed law, he also stated that he would look at the directive that was sent out to Principals in order to determine if any further clarifications are required.

□ **Internal Rules ad hoc subcommittee**: the final draft of the PC Internal Rules was presented and approved.

□ **Environmental Awareness subcommittee:** A resolution was presented to be brought to council asking that admin support each grade 7 class being educated about recycling, be it by a trip to a recycling facility or in-school presentations (SFER was presented as an option) as part of their science curriculum; the resolution passed. Two sample resolutions – one regarding a ban on single-use plastic bottles and one on the formation of an environmental awareness committee – were provided for PC reps to bring back to their GBs.

□ **Policy on Major School Change Consultation subcommittee (due April 22nd):** on Basecamp for comments; very important consultation; preliminary comments are that the timeline in schedule B is not good for GB members as it is split between two school years; a draft response will be presented on Basecamp with an e-vote to approve it for submission.

□ **AB/AV subcommittee:** an emphasis on the 'Tell Them For Me' surveys; survey responses **are** to be presented to the GB – if this is not being done the GB chair has the right to ask it of the principal. Admin has directed that going forward GBs receive a written report as a standard.

□ **Budget Consultation subcommittee:** a budget consultation response was passed via e-vote on Basecamp and ratified at this meeting.

□ **PCHS/Riverdale merger:** the PCHS GB has passed a resolution to change the name on the school's deed of establishment from Pierrefonds **Comprehensive** High School to

Pierrefonds **Community** High School; this modification to the name whilst keeping the initials is seen as a compromise embodying the coming together of two communities.

### **NEW TOPICS:**

□ **Upcoming MSC:** Chairman Noel Burke explained that the School Board is in the process of looking at the organization of the high school network and that several propositions may be put on the table regarding the schools concerned; it is highly likely that an MSC will be initiated before the end of the school year, with a formal public consultation would be launched allowing for responses to be submitted by the end of October; it is expected that by January 2020, Council would pass a resolution regarding changes to take place for the following school year.

□ **EPCA: The Future of School Boards:** EPCA President Rhonda Boucher gave a presentation underscoring the fact that the Governance Bill would be introduced soon, as well as Bill 3 – regarding taxation - and Bill 5 regarding 4-year-old kindergarten; EPCA looks to the PCs for guidance in what to do regarding the likely abolishment of school boards; PC reps and alts are to read the EPCA info and seek feedback from their GBs, PPOs, Home and School committees and parents of their school community; a subcommittee was struck to discuss and draft the PC's official position.

### VARIA:

□ The meeting continues to open with the acknowledgement of this being Mohawk land.

 $\hfill\square$  A moment was taken to acknowledge the recent mosque shootings in Christchurch, New Zealand.

□ Council was thanked for their refusal to enact/enforce Bill 21 on religious symbols in its current incarnation.

□ The ministry has instituted a mandatory twenty minutes of recess at the elementary level (without additional funds), which will impact transportation, start times, end times, and student supervision. Additional time needed will be added to the school day so as to not interfere with pedagogy. GBs will be consulted on scheduling.

□ March's joint subcommittee was cancelled. Next one to be held on May 9th, hopefully with a presentation highlighting the results of last year's survey regarding high school.

□ PC chose not to submit a response to the Consultations for By-law 1 (2019) and By-law 1E (2019) as there does not appear to be any issues with the meeting dates.

□ The PC declined to strike a subcommittee concerning the Enrichment Exams; instead members are to gather information/opinions from their GBs.

□ Three-Year Plan of Allocation and Destination of Immovables 2019-2022 Consultation was put up on Basecamp to gauge interest in submitting a response.

□ The Parent Structures Subcommittee was described and members were instructed to reflect on what does and does not work and offer up any ideas; a subcommittee will be struck.

□ SNAC's information evening - Understanding the Influence of Stress & Anxiety in our Children and Ourselves – was a great success.

□ SNAC's next meeting is April 17th.

□ PEF Comedy Benefit Show- Friday, April 5, 2019 (doors open at 7pm, show at 8 pm) at Lakeside Academy.

PEF Fun Run/Walk- Sunday, May 5, 2019 from 8-11am at Centennial Park, DDO; this event will also include particular celebrations tied to the LBPSB's 20th anniversary.
 John Rennie High School and Lasalle Community Comprehensive High School were chosen as the locations for summer school 2019.

It was resolved that LBPSB re-establish a Green Committee to make recommendations on increasing environmental awareness, recycling and other environmental initiatives.
 Pre-kindergarten for 4-year-olds will begin in September.

□ March marked Nutrition Month and many LBPSB schools participated in nutrition challenges and activities, had special guest speakers and presentations over the course of the month.

□ To show their solidarity with Swedish climate change activist Greta Thunberg, many high school and elementary schools took the opportunity to lead debates, creative projects, and demonstrations about the dangers of climate change inaction, and what needs to be done to protect the environment.

## Addendum #4 Daycare Report – April 2019

**Tax Receipts:** The second issue of tax receipts was completed this week. Families, who made additional payments on their lunch and daycare fees after February 2019, can go back on Fusion and receive an additional tax receipt, for the additional payment they made.

**Daycare Week:** The week of May 13<sup>th</sup> is daycare week this year. The theme is "You are in the Spotlight! Let's Celebrate!" The school board is hosting a 2 hour open house for all the daycare educators in the board room with a hot and cold continental breakfast. Each school was asked to create a movie theme poster to decorate the head office board room. The daycare will be holding a few special activities for the students and the staff that week, ending with Bowling at Pincourt Bowling Alley on the 19th.

**Brault and Bouthillier**: 2 staff attended a workshop at Brault and Bouthillier. The workshop focuses on new innovative games and creative art projects. The staff also picked up cooperative games and supplies as the company offers a discount to LBPSB daycares on this day.

**Registration 2019-2020**: It's that time of year! Registration forms for the daycare and lunch program will be distributed in the coming weeks, hopefully electronically. The daycare has not heard anything yet about any fee increases.

**Art Vernissage**: For the third time, the daycare is participating in the art vernissage. This year as a group, a mosaic using bottle caps of all shapes and sizes was created.

**Open House**: The daycare will have their 2 rooms set up with displays, taste testing and photo montages.

**Ped Day May 3**: Feedback from the parents was that the \$35 fee for Sportira Cage was quite costly. There was a small bit of money left after the B and B workshop so the daycare will subsidize half the bus fees for the upcoming.

**Ped Day May 17**: Has been reinstated. The daycare has organized a trip to the bowling alley at a cost of \$14/student. This is pending approval by GB.

**Defi Tchin Tchin:** A government initiative with the daycares in celebration of International Water Week (March 13-17) All the students at lunch participated in a number of activities to increase their awareness of water use, waste, and availability.

**Defi Sante:** A government initiative for the month of April – Healthy Challenge. Through the use of games, yoga, charades, cooking activities educating student on the importance and the role healthy choices make on our lifestyle and the quality of our lives. The whole daycare is participating in this initiative.
