However, in order for your child to be ready for school, we invite you to pay attention to the information included in the document attached to this letter (En route to kindergarten).


Health problems

If your child has a particular health problem (serious illness, hearing or language disorder, significant vision problem or severe allergies requiring the use of an adrenaline auto-injector) it will be important to complete the health form provided by the school. The school will provide the information to the CLSC who will contact you. For certain cases, an intervention plan must be established before the start of the school year.

GOOD VISION FACILITATES LEARNING AT SCHOOL

We suggest you see an optometrist before kindergarten begins, even if your child has no vision problems.

Eye exams are free for children at this age.

PROPER VACCINATIONS KEEP YOU HEALTHY!


For their protection, children should get a **booster shot between** the ages of 4 and 6.

During your visit, the nurse will also check for other missing vaccines.

Stay close to your child when they are brushing with fluoride toothpaste.

- l. Put a pea-sized amount of toothpaste on the toothbrush.
- 2. Make sure the toothbrush bristles touches the gums.
- 3. Don't forget to brush the tongue.
- 4. Spit out the toothpaste.



A PROGRAM FROM THE MINISTÈRE

Every year, the ministère de la Santé et des Services sociaux requires CLSC dental



hygienists to verify the need for dental sealants for all students in Grade 2 primary and Secondary II. Once their adult molars have grown in and are healthy, students can receive dental sealants at school free of charge.

It's THE BEST WAY to protect against cavities.

The dental hygienist can also support schools in implementing a supervised brushing program with fluoride toothpaste for kindergarten students age 4 and 5. Your child's school will inform you of their participation in this program, if applicable.
